## Whole School Curriculum Structure for 2023-2024

## Features of the Key Stage 3 Curriculum

- All students follow a programme of Personal, Social, Health and Citizenship Education (PSHCE) which includes elements of British values, sex and relationships, drugs, political, careers and personal finance education. This is taught by a specialist team in Years 7 to 9.
- All students follow the statutory programmes of Religious and Physical Education in Years 7 to 9.
- All students study at least 1 Modern Foreign Language in Years 7 to 9. Students select their main language of study as part of the Year 6 Induction and follow this language through KS3. The ability to study two languages at KS3 is considered for some students in Year 8 onwards.
- In addition to a core of Mathematics, Science and English, all students follow courses in Expressive Arts, Technology, Humanities and Computing.
- The taught curriculum in all years is enhanced by a full programme of extra-curricular enrichment activities.

## Features of the Key Stage 4 Curriculum

- All students follow a programme of Personal, Social, Health and Citizenship Education which includes elements of British values, sex and relationships, drugs, political, religious, careers and personal finance education taught by a specialist team in Year 10 and Year 11.
- All students follow the statutory programmes of Religious and Physical Education in Years 10 and 11.
- In addition to the core of Mathematics, Science and English, Physical Education, PSHCE and Computing, all students will study a Humanities subject, namely History or Geography, and almost all students will study a Modern Foreign Language, namely French or German. Students are able to study more than one Humanities subject or Modern Foreign Language as it can be taken as part of their free option choice.
- All students then complete their curriculum by selecting two courses from a wide variety of subjects in Expressive Arts, Technology, Computing, Business and Social Sciences.
- In the Key Stage 4 core, some students can opt to study Separate Science GCSE as an alternative to the Combined Science GCSE course. This can either be as part of their timetabled curriculum or as an extra GCSE.
- In Key Stage 4, some students can opt to study Further Mathematics as an extra GCSE qualification.
- The taught curriculum in all years is enhanced by a full programme of extra-curricular enrichment activities.

## Features of the Key Stage 5 Curriculum

- In Year 12 students normally choose three or four subjects at Level 3 to study in Years 12 and 13.
- In Year 13 a small number of students have the opportunity to study 2 subjects and complete work experience, approved by the school, as their third option.
- Each subject is usually studied for nine lessons over the 50 lesson cycle.
- All students follow a programme of Personal, Social, Health and Citizenship Education which includes elements of sex and relationship, drugs, political, careers and personal finance education. This is taught alongside the curriculum in Form Tutor lessons, Form Tutor time, extended assemblies and off timetable events.
- Students who have not achieved a grade 4 or better in GCSE in English or Maths are required to continue to study these subjects and support for retakes is provided.
- The taught curriculum in the Sixth Form is enhanced by a full programme of extra-curricular and enrichment activities. The enrichment provision forms part of students' timetabled hours, and students attend two sessions per fortnight.
