
Unit 3 – Using Social Media in Business





Social usage largely aligned across the pond, key differences: WhatsApp, Pinterest, LinkedIn Among online UK and US adults aged 18+, the % who use each network




Snapchat

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Unit 2 – Creating Systems to Manage Information (Databases)

Installing Microsoft Access

Microsoft Access is a database management tool that allows you to store data and efficiently manipulate and analyse that data. You will have an external exam using Microsoft Access so as well as using it in school, it would be beneficial for you to install it at home. Luckily, you can download it for free as part of the deal the school has with Microsoft. I hope that the instruction below will help.

Step 1

Using a desktop computer/laptop, log on to Office 365. This can be completed by visiting the school website – <u>https://helsbyhigh.org.uk</u>



Next click on the **REMOTE** link, then click on **OFFICE 365** and then **SIGN IN.**

Your email is your username with @helsbyhigh.org at the end, e.g. 20jbloggs@helsbyhigh.org and your password is the same as you use to log on to the computers in school.

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You should now have access to Office 365 as seen below:

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The menu down the left hand side allows access to online versions of Word, Excel etc. Microsoft Access cannot be used on line to it needs to be downloaded to your computer.

Step 2

From the Office 365 screen/window, click on the **INSTALL AND MORE** button on the right hand side of the screen and select **INSTALL MICROSOFT 365 APPS**.


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From the next screen, select **INSTALL OFFICE**. This will download a file called **OfficeSetup** to your computer.

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
Step 3

Locate the file that was downloaded above and double click on it to run it. Follow any prompts that appear. Your install is finished when you see the phrase, "You're all set! Office is installed now"



Step 4

Check that Microsoft Access has been installed along with the other app such as Word and Excel. Search Access or look in the menu bar.
