



EBacc

The benefits of following the EBacc are:

GCSE Science

- All students must study the 3 subjects of Science, namely Biology, Chemistry and Physics to a level that achieves a minimum of the equivalent of 2 GCSEs. This is called Combined Science.
- Students have the opportunity to take GCSE Separate Sciences which studies the science subjects to a greater depth, and students would achieve 3 separate GCSE qualifications.
- Students can either select this option as part of their free choices, or take it as an extra GCSE which includes compulsory lessons afterschool.



KS4 Options Process

- Students have an option to choose a Language from the following:
 - > French
 - > German
 - Literacy Support and Personal Development
- Students have an option to choose a Humanities subject from the following:
 - Geography
 - > History
- Students will then have 2 Free Option choices.

Please note that students can take more than one Humanities subject or Language by selecting them from the Free Option choices.

Additional Qualification



- We are also offering an additional GCSE qualification in the form of Further Mathematics for students who have a passion for this subject.
- This will be delivered through afterschool lessons 3 times per fortnight.
- Please note: The afterschool lessons for Separate Science and Further Mathematics take place at the same time, and so if a student would like to take both, they must select Separate Science as one of their Free Choices.

- Students and parents/carers are encouraged to view these materials to support their decision making



Students should select the MFL that they have studied from Year 7. If a student wishes to take both MFLs, the second must be selected as one of the Free Option choices and will be discussed on an individual basis with the Department Leader for MFL. This is the same for if a student wishes to take both Humanities.

We appreciate that studying a MFL may not be appropriate for a small number of students. As such these students can select Literacy Support and Personal Development. This is not a GCSE qualification, however students will receive support in these areas to assist their wider curriculum.
