GCSE and Level 2 Vocational Qualifications for Summer 2025

- External examinations will take place in Summer 2025.
- External GCSE examination dates:

Thursday 1st May – Wednesday 25th June

National Contingency Days

Wednesday 11th June pm only Wednesday 25th June all day



External Examinations

- Students issued with a full examination timetable as well as their personalised timetable for the exams.
- This details the number and duration of each exam that will be undertaken in each subject area and on what date and time.
- This timetable is fixed as all students nationally must complete the examinations at the same time.



External Examinations

- Throughout the exam period, we have designed a bespoke timetable for students to provide exam preparation sessions ahead of each examination.
- Students will be expected to continue to attend school full time until Friday 23rd May.
- Study Leave for students will commence from Monday 2nd June.
- Students are expected to attend school from Monday 2nd June if they have an examination that day or to attend an exam preparation session that they have been invited to.



Examination Times

Students should attend their exams promptly.

Morning exams

- Arrive at school no later than 8:35am and report to the Dining Hall or LRC.
- Official start time for exam is 9:00am.

Afternoon Exams

- Report to the Dining Hall no later than 1:00pm.
- Official start time for exam is 1:30pm.

Student Expectations

- Students MUST write their legal name on the exam paper.
- Students should ensure they have all material and resources required in a CLEAR PENCIL CASE:
- BLACK pen
- Pencil
- Ruler
- Protractor
- Calculator (when applicable)



Student Expectations

- Students must wear their school uniform for exams. No additional clothing items will be permitted into the exam venue.
- Mobile phones must be switched off and placed in their bag.
- Students are not permitted to wear any type of watch or ear pod in the examination. These should also be left in their bag.
- Students must ensure they sit at their designated seat.
- Students must not write on the exam paper until instructed to do so by the invigilator.
- Students must not doodle on the exam paper.
- Students must ensure they do not have any additional notes, either in paper form or written on their body when entering the exam.



Student Expectations

- We encourage all students to check the paper on the desk is the exam that they are expecting and of the correct tier of entry or coloured paper (if applicable). Any concerns are to be reported to the invigilator ASAP.
- Students are only permitted to use the toilet during an examination in an emergency – we encourage all students to visit the toilet before entering the exam venue.
- Students must only write within the designated space on the exam paper. If they require additional space, they must ask the invigilator for additional paper.



Access Arrangements

- Access Arrangements are for those students whose normal ways of working include such arrangements, for example a Reader, Scribe, Extra-Time etc.
- Students who are eligible for Access
 Arrangements will have these administered for the examinations. Students will have been made aware of these arrangements ahead of the exams.



Student Absence

- It is the responsibility of all students with the support of their parents/carers to ensure they attend all examinations.
- If a student misses an examination without a justifiable reason, they will not be issued any marks for this exam, having a detrimental effect on their overall grade.



Student Absence

- If a student is unable to attend the examination due to illness, parents/carers are to contact the school as soon as practicably possible. We will discuss this with you to determine if alternative arrangements can be made or if we can apply for Special Consideration. exams@helsbyhigh.org

What happens if the Fire Alarm sounds?

- Students stop writing, put down their pens and close their exam papers. The invigilators will note down the time.
- Students will be escorted in silence out of the exam room by the invigilator to a separate area on the school field (behind the Year 9 students)
- Students have to stand in the same order as their exam seating plan in complete silence.
- At the end of the evacuation, students will be escorted back into the exam by the invigilators.
- Students will have the full time allowed for the exam and will not be penalised.

- Friday 23rd May Year 11 Leavers celebration assembly will take place in the afternoon.







Ways to help your child

- Encourage your child to follow their revision timetable.
- Encourage your child to use the available revision resources.
- Remind them that the better they prepare and the more confident they feel in their subject knowledge the less stressed they will feel when the exams start.
- Make sure your child has a quiet space to work, with no distractions.
- Be around as much as possible. You don't have to be at their side 24/7 but children like parents taking an interest in their revision (but not taking over).
- Check in with them, how are they feeling?



Ways to help your child

- Keep the kitchen cupboard stocked with delicious food.
 When the going gets tough children really appreciate a favourite drink, a plate of biscuits or their favourite meal.
- Encourage them to break revision into manageable chunks and to take regular breaks in between revision sessions. It's far more effective to do 30 minutes of successful revision rather than plough on for hours on end and not get anywhere.
- Encourage them to get out for some exercise and fresh air, and to eat healthy food and get lots of sleep.
- Most important of all, help your child to keep everything in perspective.
