How to Find Apprenticeships

Find an Apprenticeship

- Search around your postcode for Advanced (level 3), Higher (Level 4) or Degree (Level 6) apprenticeships. Check start dates as you can't start an apprenticeship until after year 13. Check entry requirements carefully, including qualifications, experience, skills and whether a car is required. Make sure you create an account and register as otherwise you may not be able to apply for a vacancy. You can also get alerts on your phone for new vacancies. [Click here](#)

Prospects

- Prospects gives a great overview of degree apprenticeships as well as specific information on different sectors e.g. Business, Health Care, IT, Law, Engineering. It lists the main companies offering higher and degree apprenticeships. You can then go on to company websites to see if they are recruiting, vacancies are usually found in the "Careers" section. Register on Prospects for alerts to new vacancies in the sectors which interest you. [Click here](#)

UCAS

- There is lots of useful info on UCAS in the **Apprenticeship** section at the top of the page, you can create an account for new vacancy alerts and search using your location, sector, start date through the search engine.
